Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 12 Sociology Trip to The Old Bailey

As part of the A-Level Sociology course, students are required to understand the causes of crime and how the criminal justice system works. They will also need to be able to understand how Sociologists can research aspects of the criminal justice system and what the potential strengths and limitations of the different research methods are. For these reasons we are pleased to offer your son/daughter the opportunity to take part in a visit to The Old Bailey.

The visit will take place on Monday 9th July 2018 from 9.00am to 2.30pm. The visit is completely voluntary. However we believe that this will be a valuable addition to your son/daughter's understanding of how criminal justice operates in the UK.

The visit to The Old Bailey is free. However, please ensure that your son/daughter has sufficient funds on their oyster card to facilitate the journey.

All students are encouraged to travel by tube to St Paul's underground station. If you would like your son/daughter to travel with a member of staff they will need to meet Mr Wellstead at 8.15am at South Ruislip station. If you would like your son/daughter to travel independently to and from the venue, please indicate this on the reply slip attached. We envisage arriving back in Ruislip no later than 2.30pm where students will be dismissed. We will need to meet as a group at St Paul's station no later than 9.00am. Students are expected to wear smart attire, appropriate for entering the court.

The schedule for the day once we arrive is as follows:

Meet at St Paul's station at 9.00am. Walk to The Old Bailey. The court opens for its morning session at 9.55am when visitors can take their pick of criminal cases in session. Entry to The Old Bailey is on a first come first served basis, therefore we aim to be there at least 30 minutes early to join the queue. The Old Bailey courts rise at 12.40pm. We will allow 30 minutes for lunch and then travel home.

Due to numbers, when we go into The Old Bailey we will need to go into a number of different courts which means your son/daughter may not be supervised by a member of staff.

Please Note: The Old Bailey is a high security court and mobile phones, cameras, food, drink, rucksacks and MP3 players are not allowed in. There is a travel agent and a newsagent that both offer a service to look after these items for a small fee. But it is obviously best for students to have as few items with them as possible.
