Dear Parent/Carer,

Year 12 Summer Examination Timetable 2019

Please find the timetable for Year 12 into 13 progression examinations that take place between **Monday 24th and Friday 28th June**. During this time, students only need to be in school for their relevant examinations; however, they are welcome to use the study facilities in school if they want to. I have attached the timetable with this letter but each student has already been issued with their own specific timetable.

Students must recognise the importance of these examinations as they measure the suitability of students to progress to Year 13 and a 'D' grade is the benchmark required to access the demands of a Year 13 course. Students who do not achieve a 'D' grade or above may not be able to continue with that subject into Year 13.

Exams are scheduled to take place in the Main Hall and students must arrive 10 minutes before the start of their exam in order to be registered. Students should be appropriately dressed in accordance to the Sixth Form dress code and **must** have their lanyard. Failure to meet these requirements could result in students being unable to sit their exams.

Unlike other assessments during the year, results for these exams will be released on a centralised results day at 14:00 on Tuesday 16th July in the Main Hall. Students will receive an envelope of results and there will be members of the Sixth Form Team on hand to support students. Members of the Sixth Form team will be meeting with certain students across the rest of that week to discuss progress into Year 13 along with any other issues that have arisen.

These exams will also be the basis for the predicted grade that teachers will be asked to generate for each student who is making a UCAS application. Teaching staff will take into account the student's classwork and assessments throughout the year but the performance in these summer exams will be a strong determining factor. Whilst we of course want to help students as much as possible with their UCAS application we have to ensure that the predicted grades are realistic and fair for each individual student. The final decision for predicted grades will rest with the subject teacher and their professional judgement regarding the most likely grade that the student will achieve.
