Year 13 History Trip to the Tower of London

I am delighted to be able to offer your child the opportunity to attend a Year 13 History trip to The Tower of London on **Friday 20th January 2023**. This trip fits perfectly with your child's work on the Tudors which I have been teaching them about for their A Levels.

As part of this trip, the students will have a guided tour by a Beefeater, the chance to explore the Tower themselves as well as an interactive lecture on Henry VIII's reformation which is a key exam topic for the Tudor course.

Students will be expected to make their own way to the Tower of London for 9.30am. The nearest tube station is Tower Hill. More specific meeting details will be issued in class nearer the time of the trip. Students will then be met by staff who will escort them into the Tower itself. Students will be free to wear their own clothes and will not be required to wear formal Sixth Form uniform. Whilst there are shops nearby, students cannot come and go from the Tower so I would advise that students bring lunch with them. Following the session, students will be dismissed to make their own way home at approximately 3.00pm.

The trip is currently limited to 20 students, on a first-come-first-serve basis on payment. If you wish for your child to attend this trip, please make the payment of **£15.00** via ParentPay, selecting 'Year 13 Tower of London – 2022/23', by no later than **Friday 25th November**. Please be aware that when we have run this trip before, tickets have sold out extremely quickly. Should maximum numbers be reached prior to 25th November, ParentPay will close for this item.

Please note that upon making your payment you are agreeing to the following terms and conditions associated with this trip:

Your permission is granted for your child:

- To attend the trip
- To be given a mild painkiller (eg. Paracetamol) if considered necessary by the party leader
- To receive medical treatment in an emergency situation if as parent/carer you cannot be contacted.

You confirm:

- That your child's medical details are correct on Arbor and will inform us of any changes to these details between now and the trip
- That you understand that if your child's behaviour in school is not acceptable then they may be withdrawn from the trip and any monies paid to date will not be refunded.
